Roger had spoken to the club a few years ago to give an introduction and today, he and Kathleen showed the positive results as well as growth. Jeremiah's Crossing started with six riders, and now have grown to sixty-four riders!

The club found the riders learn not only to ride a horse but gain confidence in other aspects of life, and much more. Many events such as parades and barbeques are held to raise money for the organization. Volunteers donate as much as five hours of their time daily to help a rider with his or her ride which includes preparation, the ride, and clean up. Rotarians were encouraged to volunteer, if they desired, as the reward for rider and volunteer are many. Roger said a future goal for Jeremiah's Crossing is to get enough support to build an arena.
