**River Cities Band Trip Update:** The Board has approved a \$1000 grant from the Benevolence Fund to help support the River Cities Band Trip to Europe to help raise money for Polio Plus. Additionally every club in the district will be asked to support the trip.

**Auction News:** Sue Siewert announced that the next meeting regarding the auction would be Tuesday, Feb. 2, at From the Ground Up. Lenore Frost is a member of the Little Shell Chippewa Tribe of Landless Indians. She described how she became aware of her heritage at a Sun Dance and pow wow at Crow Agency in the Pryor Mountains in Montana. She talked about some of the problems that exist among Native Americans today, particularly on the reservations, such as low self-esteem and alcoholism. Integration into “contemporary” society has been difficult and consequently many of the traditions are lost and the tribes lose their identity to the point that extinction of the tribes is becoming a reality. Lenore’s tribe was one of the first to integrate into society and never established its own reservation. Lenore brought some Native American art from her shop The Dream Catcher Gallery. This included some ledger art, baskets, dream catchers, and a jingle dress which is passed down from generation to generation and used for dancing.
