Congratulations, Ida Lee Siewert: Sunrise Rotarian Ida Lee Siewert was named the Citizen of the Year at the Heart of Wisconsin Business Alliance's annual dinner on Feb. 5. Fellow Rotarian and former Citizen of the Year Pat Schuetz had made the nomination, citing her respect for Ida Lee "as a vital and caring part of our community."
